PDT Wins Gold Star... Again

Phi Delta Theta held its annual **Emerging Leadership Institute** in Oxford late this past August. During these four days, young men were given the tools to succeed and help guide each of their respective chapters. Along with this workshop, General Headquarters gave out its awards based on the accomplishments of the past year. At the awards banquet, the Ohio Zeta chapter of Phi Delta Theta was awarded the Gold Star for the second consecutive year, an award given to the top chapters of Phi Delta Theta nationally.

The award is handed out to a select number of chapters based on a wide range of requirements. The criteria includes all parts of fraternity life, such as grades, community service, athletics, financial operations, recruitment, risk management, and chapter size.

Along with winning the Gold Star, the men of Ohio Zeta were awarded the General Headquarters Trophy, also known as the GHQ trophy. This award is built upon a point system where points are given to each chapter according to bills that are paid on time and monthly updates that are sent to nationals. Ohio Zeta was one of a select few chapters nationally who received a perfect score.
